As UFUQ Health & Welfare Officer, I am currently reviewing Australian Standards "High Visibility Safety Garments" with UFUA ISO Delegate Mark Gribble at Australian Standards.

This Australian Standard currently specifies the visual requirements for high visibility safety garments to be worn by people who are exposed when directing traffic or other activities in the workplace.

There is currently no standard and/or coverage for firefighters in this Australian Standard when firefighters are working on roadways at emergency incidents >Road Crash Rescue / Motor Vehicle Fires / Wildland Fires near and/or adjacent to roadways.

What the UFUQ Health & Welfare does not want implemented is the use of "SAFETY VESTS" over the structural firefighting ensemble at any of the emergency incidents detailed. [Road Crash Rescue / Motor Vehicle Fires / Wildland Fires].

As a member of the Australian Standards Committee, we are reviewing the Australian Standard 4602 "High Visibility Safety Garments" and UFUQ Health & Welfare is assisting to develop a part 2, directly relating to:



"Firefighters Working on Roadways"

The hazard identified for a firefighter is working in smoke / night time / In-climate weather at emergency incidents on roadways and the real danger of being exposed to oncoming traffic.

UFUQ Health & Welfare is representing UFUQ members state-wide to address identified deficiencies in workplace health and safety when working in their "workplace" i.e. emergency incidents with limited visibility of firefighters

working in these very dangerous conditions.

UFUQ Health & Welfare will advise UFUQ members of the outcomes in Addressing our members safety when working on roadways.

<u>March 20, 2012</u> Project Team Meeting - Wildland / [RTC] Ensemble Specifications now completed and to be released shortly for public submission to "Manufactures" to submit their wildland / [RTC] Road Traffic Crash ensemble for evaluation and pragmatic tests.

[Urban >specific colour ensemble and Rural >specific colour ensemble]

The Wild-land / RTC ensemble is a single layer jacket and single layer overtrouser and is replacing the current <u>QFRS bushfire jacket</u>.

Under Workplace Health Safety Act 2011, the introduction of an alternative ensemble addresses Workplace Health Safety & Wellness in relation to Firefighter Fatigue, Heat Stress Management.

UFUQ Health and Welfare is aware the heat stress buildup and firefighter fatigue concerns when wearing your structural firefighting ensemble at structural fires.

To wear a structural firefighting ensemble at [RTC] Road Traffic Crash and Wildland fire/s is not a practical workplace Health and safety consideration for UFUQ members.

APPLIED ERGONOMICS and the FIREFIGHTER

<u>Air Management</u> and <u>Physiological</u> responses during simulated firefighting Tasks in a high rise structure

UFU members state-wide will encounter emergency situations in high-rise buildings in which it is necessary to enter the fire while breathing from their self –contained breathing apparatus [B/A], if not lift viability, climb several flights of stairs, perform fire suppression or emergency search and rescue operations and be able to safely exit the building to the B/A entry point.

To date only [1] one study has been has measured oxygen uptake [VO2], while using Breathing Apparatus but firefighters did not report on "air consumption" for different tasks and the data were not able to inform on an Air Management strategy.

The study was intensive but I would like to summarize for your referral:

Simulations of two high-rise firefighting simulations of continuous stair climbing, plus exit & [5] fifth floor search & rescue task that individual firefighters could use air at a rate causing their whistle warning device to activate in as little as 8:14 minutes & that 50% of firefighters could have their whistle warning device sound within 11-12 minutes when working at a rate the firefighter self s elected as their normal effort.

A worker's work entitlements are to be preserved during any period of ceased unsafe work.

emanating from an immediate or imminent exposure to a hazard.

Under the new term "CEASE WORK", a worker may cease, or refuse to carry

out work if the worker has a reasonable concern that to carry out the work would expose the worker to a serious risk to the worker's health or safety,

Have a drink of WATER <u>NOW</u> Your [HSR] Health Safety Representative and/or [DHSR] Deputy Health Safety Representative may direct a worker who is in a "workgroup" represented by the representative to cease work if the representative has a reasonable concern that to carry out the work would expose the worker to a serious risk to the worker's health or safety, emanating from an immediate or imminent exposure to a hazard.



Prior to cease work, the [HSR] Health Safety Representative and [DHSR] Deputy Health Safety Representative must make effort to resolve the work health Safety issue with the relevant person conducting the business [DCS / QFRS State].

So what does that mean to you as an employee in a "workgroup", if you feel there is a deficiency in OHS / WHS that will directly impact on your immediate and/or long term health and safety, you must step up and advise your [HSR] Health Safety Representative and/or [DHSR] Deputy Health Safety Representative.

- Minimum [2] Two structural firefighting ensembles Each member to have as minimum [PPC] > [1] one PBI Gold Matrix structural firefighting ensemble [2011] & second ensemble no older than ADA Generation 3 [2007]
- Minimum [2] Two sets of [PPE] Personal Protective Equipment Each member to have as minimum [PPE] > [2] Two structural firefighting helmets, [2] flash hoods, [2] sets of structural firefighting gloves
- Review of the [PPC] Personal Protective Clothing <u>LAUNDRY</u> Process UFUQ Health & Welfare to address unacceptable timeframes in LAUNDRY of PPE / PPC turn round times state-wide for our members
- Review of structural firefighting boots > Bunker / GP's
 UFUQ Health & Welfare AUDIT of UFUQ members state-wide to ensure
 our members have been provided with the appropriate footwear for
 structural firefighting and an external review of the most appropriate
 footwear for [RTC] Road Traffic Crash and Wildland Fires.
